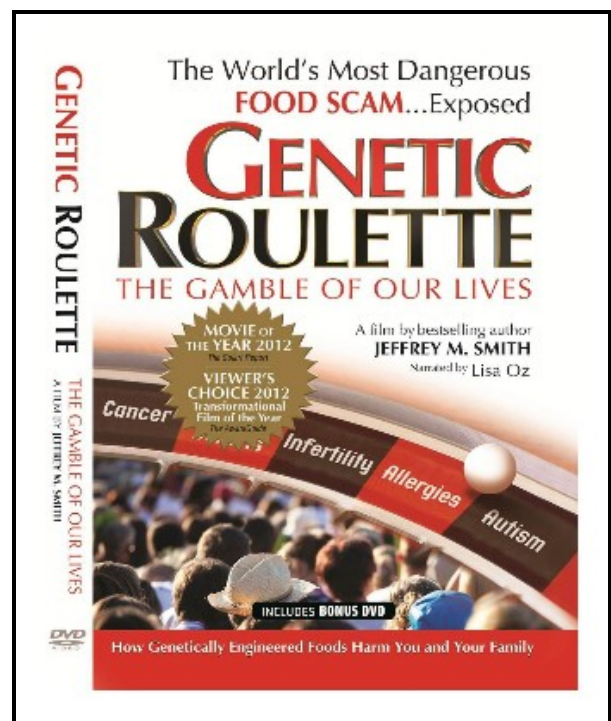
Evidence points to genetically engineered food being a cause of gastrointestinal disorders, allergies, inflammatory diseases and infertility.

....when we lost power for about 5 hours during a storm, we were scrambling around in the darkness, looking for matches, candles, flashlights, etc. Then we looked outside and noticed our solar lights shining brightly all around our patio, stairs, dock, etc. They were beautiful.

We stuck the solar light pipes into plastic drink bottles containers and they made the nicest, brightest, safest, lighting you could ever imagine. We put one in the bathroom, the kitchen, the living room, etc. And there was plenty of light.

There are all types of solar lights available. We bought ours at Harbor Freight. We put them all around our yard. They look nice

and they do not attract flying bugs like the outdoor lights around our doorway.

The solar lights burn all night long, if you need them. The next day, you just take your solar lights back outside and they will instantly recharge and be ready for you to use again any time you need them. They are perfect for power outages, hurricanes, etc.
